Eligibility: JUNIORS & SENIORS: Attending an accredited high school in Alaska, Oregon or Western Washington; Graduate in 2017 or 18 with plans to attend an accredited higher education institution; and meet the academic requirements, with a GPA of 3.25 or higher. Group applications may have no more than three students.
